This installation includes a selection of major works from MAM's growing permanent collection of international art of the 20th and 21st centuries.

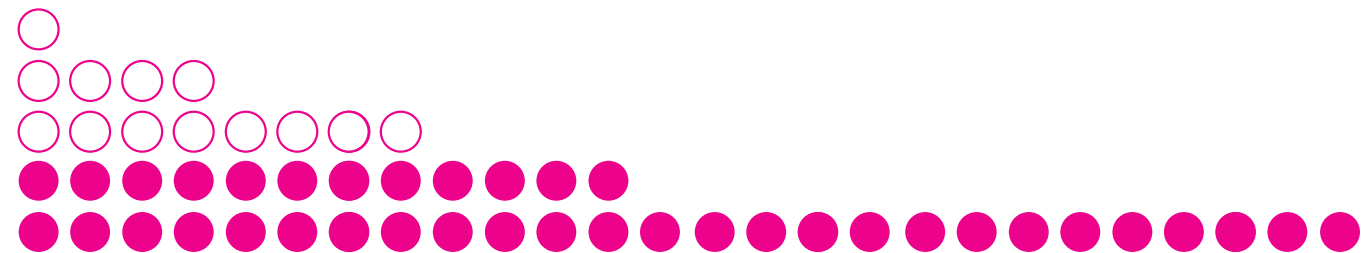

## FREE MUSEUM VISITS

10am & 11:30am Tuesday through Friday

MAM's lively, interactive museum tours for kindergarten through twelfth grade students form the centerpiece of the MAM & Schools program. These inquiry-based tours are designed to develop an understanding of modern and contemporary art while encouraging self expression at every grade level. Tours foster observation, analysis and interpretation of the culture of our times, complementing school curricula and promoting the critical thinking skills emphasized by **Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) guidelines**. Led by MAM's professional gallery teachers, visits are approximately **90 minutes** in length and culminate in an interactive exercise.

MAM can provide a limited number of **free buses** to Miami-Dade County Public Schools. The museum schedules tours on a first-come, first-served basis throughout the academic year. **There is no charge for museum visits.**



## FREE CLASSROOM VISITS

9am – 1pm Tuesday through Friday

MAM offers teachers **free** classroom visits that introduce students to exhibitions on view and enhance school curriculum. Museum gallery teachers bring representations of selected artworks and lead students in observation and discussion. Classroom visits include an activity and last approximately one hour. In addition, MAM gallery teachers can visit schools on **Career Days** to talk about museums and related professions.

## SELF-GUIDED VISITS

1pm – 4pm Tuesday through Friday  
Noon – 4pm Saturday and Sunday

Teachers may choose to bring their classes on their own to the museum during regular viewing hours. **Free** for all students with a valid ID. Please notify MAM in advance if you are planning a self-guided visit to ensure your trip does not coincide with other group visits. Please note that museum-led tours do take precedence.

As a contemporary art museum, MAM is able to offer students with a special interest in art unique opportunities to meet the artists of works on view in the museum's galleries or the curators who create MAM's exhibitions.



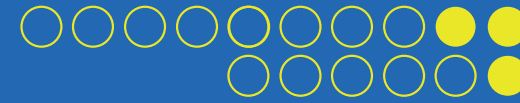
## SCHOLASTIC ART AWARDS AND EXHIBITION

## FREE TEACHER WORKSHOPS

Twice a year MAM offers educators free professional workshops designed to explore teaching strategies and interdisciplinary connections to works of art in MAM's special exhibitions. Workshops include private curator-led tours, as well as hands-on activities and discussions with curators, artists and scholars. Each workshop provides the opportunity to network with colleagues and share perspectives on new approaches to education. To participate, teachers must register with MAM prior to the workshop.



## CURRICULUM RESOURCE UNITS

At our scheduled Teacher Workshops, MAM distributes curriculum resource units for classroom use to provide teachers with visuals, background information and suggestions for curricular applications. For teachers unable to attend a workshop, a limited number of the CRUs are available for a minimal shipping and handling fee.
