



**Miami Art Museum Slates Corporate Luncheon
to Honor UBS, First Corporate Honors Recipient;
Justin Rockefeller to Keynote**

Miami Art Museum today announced that the global financial services firm UBS will receive MAM's first Corporate Honors Award for outstanding support of the visual arts in South Florida on Tuesday, June 3, at its inaugural Corporate Luncheon, which will feature Justin Rockefeller as keynote speaker.

UBS will receive the honor at the inaugural MAM Corporate Luncheon, which will take place at the Four Seasons Hotel, 1435 Brickell Avenue, Downtown Miami, beginning with a reception at 11:30am, followed by a luncheon and program from noon to 2pm. This Corporate Luncheon is the first of what will be an annual recognition event honoring the corporate community's integral support of the visual arts in South Florida.

The Honorary Chair for the event is Alberto Ibargüen, President and CEO, John S. and James L. Knight Foundation. Co-chairs are Rafael Miyar, Former Senior Vice President, Banco Santander Central-Hispano and Louis-Albert H. Jolivet, Vice-President, J.P. Morgan Private Bank, Miami. Aetna is the presenting sponsor for the event.

“UBS was selected by MAM's Board of Trustees as the winner of our first Corporate Honors Award, which recognizes businesses whose philanthropy has made a major impact on the cultural vitality of South Florida.” MAM Director Terence Riley said. “The Trustees cited UBS not only for their preeminence in the support of major contemporary art projects around the world but for their specific role as Main Sponsor of Art Basel Miami Beach. This art fair, which has proved here to be so much more than just that, draws over 40,000 visitors to Miami and has helped spotlight the local art scene to such a degree that Miami is largely viewed as one of the world's art capitals today.”

Keynote speaker Justin Rockefeller will address his family's philanthropic legacy as well as his individual role as Co-Founder and National Program Director of Generation Engage.

GenerationEngage is a nonpartisan youth-civic-engagement initiative that connects young Americans to political leaders, to other civic organizations, and to meaningful debate about the future they will inherit. The organization is built on three principles:

- Young people suffer not from a lack of interest, but from a lack of access;
- Our democracy should be a dialogue, not a monologue;

- The best investment we can make in the future of our democracy is in young leaders at the local level.
